- 3) Generate solutions to address these barriers to breast cancer care

Abstract: There are over 5 million individuals in the United States who identify as American Indian and Alaskan Native, and for Pima County specifically, 4.4% of the population identify as Native American. Unfortunately, there are persistent disparities in breast cancer screening and treatment in the Native American population. While breast cancer mortality has significantly decreased for White and Black women over the past 3 decades, the breast cancer mortality rate for Native Americans has remained unchanged. In this presentation, we will discuss the barriers to care that are unique to the Native American population since these barriers contribute to this persistent healthcare disparity. We will then propose potential solutions to address these barriers and work towards eliminating this healthcare disparity.
